

# BERGY BITS & GROWLERS



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## Icebergs in the ANTARCTIC:

- are often tabular shaped (shaped like a table top).
- can be several miles long.
- are larger and more numerous than in the Arctic.

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- are often tabular shaped (shaped like a table top).
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Icebergs the size of a small house are called **BERGY BITS**.

Smaller icebergs with little ice above water are called **GROWLERS**.

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Only **1/10** of an iceberg is above the water surface.

DRINKABLE GLACIERS

Glaciers are formed from precipitation so they are a source of **FRESH WATER** for populations all over the world.

Mountain glaciers are **retreating** (getting smaller as they melt).

In the future, mountain glaciers will not provide **enough water** for many populations.

*fresh water*

Icebergs that calve (break off) from glaciers in polar regions are a good fresh water supply.

Glaciers store between 70% and 80% of all the fresh water in the world.

If all land ice melted, the seas would rise about 70 meters. (230 feet)

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
